- **Thin Ice – Always check ice thickness**
- **Open Water and Rivers – Check with local harvesters and Elders for safe routes when travelling on the land.**



Let people know where you are going and what time you are expected to be back.

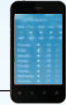
Know Where You Are Going

Bring GPS and a map to help you navigate and share travel routes with family and friends



Weather Forecast

Check the weather forecast before you leave



Never Travel Alone

Two people are better than one



First Aid

Always take a first-aid kit, even if you are planning to travel a few hours.



Extra Clothing

Always bring extra clothing in case of accidents occurring



Extra Supplies

Pack more food, water and fuel, clean up after yourself and don't leave garbage



Keep in Touch

Have ways to communicate – bring a radio, satellite phone and spot device for GPS



Stay Warm

Pack a lamp, stove, fuel, candles, matches, lighter, flashlights, extra batteries and a sleeping bag



Shelter

Weather can change, travel delays happen – carry a tent and tarp for protection from cold weather
